The 98th MSC Birthday Celebration - 30 June 2015

Chuck Adams, SCA Vice-President asks that you save the date and lend a hand with the Celebration!

The Medical Service Corps as we know it was founded on 30 June 1917. In preparation for the 98th Anniversary your Silver Caduceus Association has developed a program to assist in marking the occasion across the country at as many posts, camps and stations as possible. In an effort to assist with defraying the cost of putting on the birthday celebration, the SCA Board has authorized an amount up to \$100 for each location with a total budget not to exceed \$2000 for all locations. The Board asked me to be the point person in this endeavor, and given that challenge I identified one or more current SCA members at each of 30 locations around the country. With the locations identified I sent emails to SCA members around the country on 18 May 2015 asking them to contact their MSC leaders at a specific location nearby. I have received some good and positive responses, specifically from Fort Richardson, AK, Fort Carson, CO, Fort Sill, OK, Fort Jackson, SC, and Fort Sam Houston, TX where COL(R) Johnnie Johnson is spearheading the event. By my count there are an additional 25 major Army Posts where SCA members have yet to answer the mail. I would ask that if you are reading this newsletter and live near an Army installation not named above where there are MSC officers assigned, please give the senior MSC leadership at the Post a call to see what is planned for the 98th MSC Birthday Celebration. We will probably find that at least some, if not many, are planning a celebration but don't know that the Silver Caduceus Association is willing and able to get involved and lend assistance. SCA Member Writes Book Accepted for Publication

A charter member of the SCA has written a book that has been accepted for publication by the University of North Texas Press. Jim Van Straten's book entitled, *A Different Face of War: Memories of a Medical Service Corps Officer in Vietnam,* will be published in late October or November. The book appears to be the first ever written and accepted for publication by a Medical Service Corp officer describing the day-to-day activities of MSC officers in a combat environment.

Because of personal circumstances that existed when Van Straten was deployed to Vietnam (a continuing life-threatening illness of an infant son, the youngest of six children all aged ten years and under) he felt the need to write his wife a daily letter. Those letters became her life-line to her husband during difficult and trying times. Jim wrote 352 letters to his wife Patricia during his deployment and she saved them all. The letters became the primary source for the book, providing accurate sequencing and vivid descriptions of the events that occurred during his deployment. The book should have broad appeal for military individuals and families.

LTG Quinn H. Becker, former U.S. Army Surgeon General and honorary member of the SCA, was asked by the publisher, along with several historians who have published books on the Vietnam War, to read the manuscript and provide a blurb to be used in marketing the book. General Becker wrote as follows:

"Daily letters home are the basis of this important memoir. The author's insight into all that was swirling around him was outstanding. He was on the move all the time, in the air and on the ground, in hostile territory and in the relative sanctuary of the cities. He witnessed what is recorded. If you have any interest in the history of the Vietnam War, the age-old culture, values, and religions of the Vietnamese people, the terrible effects of the war on the civilian population and the challenges of providing medical advisory support—this book is for you. I had one problem with it. I could not lay it down."—LTG Quinn H. Becker, U.S. Army Retired, Former U.S. Army Surgeon General

The book will be easy to identify because Van Straten insisted that the publisher place an image of the MSC silver caduceus on the cover. Jim sought and received permission from the Office of Licensing and Trademarks, Department of Army, to use the image in this manner. Quite a number of MSC officers are mentioned in the book.

In a future edition of the SCA Newsletter, as more information about publication becomes available, we'll provide a description of the book and information regarding where it may be purchased.
