As we prepare for Christmas, Hanukkah and the New Year, 2018 promises to be an exciting year for your Silver Caduceus Association. It is a Reunion year, and as reported in the last newsletter the Reunion will be held in San Antonio, and a new date has been set for 24 - 27 October 2018. Our venue for 2018, the Holiday Inn Airport, offered extra incentives for this date, and the date worked well with the Fort Sam Houston Golf Club for Friday's tournament. The Reunion committee is working hard to put together a quality program with a focus on a series of updates and pertinent information for members and spouses alike. CPT Merle L. Gilbert completed his bachelor's degree in Biochemistry and doctorate in Pharmacology at the University of Washington in Seattle, WA. He later served as a postdoctoral fellow at Oregon Health and Sciences University in Portland, OR and received a direct commission in the Medical Service Corps in 2015. CPT Gilbert is currently assigned as a Research Biochemist to the US Army Medical Research Institute of Infectious Diseases (USAMRIID) at Ft. Detrick, MD. In 2015, he served as OIC of the USAMRIID Genomics Laboratory in Liberia during the West Africa Ebola Outbreak. CPT Gilbert supported Centers for Disease Control and Prevention efforts to identify the origin of 15 new Ebola cases that emerged as Liberia was on its way to being declared Ebola-free. Since then, his research activities have focused on testing and evaluation of novel antimicrobial compounds with activity against potential biological warfare agents.

CPT Gilbert also currently serves as the OIC for mobile operations in support of the Joint Mobile Emerging Disease Intervention Clinical Capability (JMEDICC) program. During suspected Ebola outbreaks in Uganda, this mobile clinical treatment and laboratory platform will deploy and support 28 physicians, nurses, laboratory staff, and support personnel in the field. The JMEDICC team will conduct Phase II clinical trials for investigational new drugs designed to treat Ebola virus infections. These clinical trial data will be used to support new drug applications for Food and Drug Administration regulatory approval.

During his enlisted service as a Korean linguist, CPT Gilbert led tactical intelligence collection teams against foreign language targets. His teams intercepted, translated, and analyzed signals intelligence in support of brigade combat teams in the 2nd Infantry Division (Republic of Korea) and the 25th Infantry Division (Schofield Barracks, HI), as well as 1st Special Forces Group (Joint Base Lewis-McChord, WA).

CPT Gilbert's awards and decorations include: Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal (4 BOLC), Army Achievement Medal (1 SOLC), National Defense Service Medal (w/bronze star), Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Korea Defense Service Medal, Ranger Tab, Senior Parachutist Badge, Air Assault Badge, and Korean Parachutist Badge.

To post an article, start a discussion or comment on a discussion on our SCA LinkedIn site the following steps are recommended:

- 1. Sign in to LinkedIn
- 2. Click on "Interests" in the top dock which is a black header and choose "Groups"
- 3. Click on "My Groups" in the blue dock under the dock described in #2 above
- 4. Click on "SCA"
- 5. Click on "Enter a conversation title..."
- 6. Type your title of article, post or discussion in the first window
- 7. Type your discussion or post in the second window
- 8. Go to the extreme right side of the page when finish and click on "POST"

To comment on an article or discussion already posted:

- 1. Sign in to LinkedIn
- 2. Click on "Interests" in the top dock which is a black header and choose "Groups"
- 3. Click on "My Groups" in the blue dock under the dock described in #2 above
- 4. Click on "SCA"

5. Choose the discussion, article or previous post which you wish to comment, by scrolling down through the various post

- 6. Click on "comment"
- 7. Type your comment in the window that appears
- 8. Go to the extreme right side of the page when finish and click on "POST"


We already have a good core group of almost 200 SCA members signed up and we strongly urge all our members to do the same.
