<u>Team 20</u>

Howdy, all. I trust you and yours are well.

In May, Rich Ursone, Gregg Stevens, and I had the honor of attending MG Mike Talley's two-day meeting of MSC consultants on Fort Sam Houston. Bottom line up front: <u>our Corps is in</u> <u>excellent hands with Mike, our 20th Corps Chief, and his</u> <u>team, "Team 20,"</u> focused on today and tomorrow during very complex and fast-moving times to do what's right for our MSC Soldiers and those they treat and support.

Team 20 changes:

We had the opportunity to visit with Colonel Heidi Mon. Heidi currently commands Dwight D. Eisenhower Army Medical Center. This summer she will relinquish command and become the

Deputy Corps Chief. Colonel Tony King, the current Deputy, will depart to take command of the 30th Medical Brigade.

Also new to Team 20 is LTC Joe Walker, Executive Officer to the Office of the Corps Chief.

The MSC of 2030:

A primary goal for the Chief is to ensure the Corps is using <u>policy</u> <u>changes, leadership reform, personnel management, and</u> <u>targeted training opportunities to modernize the Corps for</u> <u>2030 and beyond</u> in an increasingly volatile environment characterized by the operational challenges of multi-domain operations during large scale combat operations (LSCO).

You can get a feel for the Army's approach to LSCO by reviewing the current edition of Field Manual 3.0 Operations (we old timers will remember it as FM 100-5 Operations).

General Talley introduced three LSCO-critical medical observations gleaned from combat operations in Ukraine: <u>clear</u> <u>the battlefield, handle mass casualty events, and respond to</u> <u>contested logistics</u>.

To that end, the discussions among consultants and back briefs to the Chief centered on five draft MSC campaign objectives in support of a draft MSC campaign plan that will support the Army Medicine Campaign Plan which, in turn, supports Army and National Security priorities. The proposed MSC campaign objectives are:

- CO1: Recruit and Retain MSC Talent.
- CO2: Engage the Total Force.
- CO3: Develop MSCs for Future Operating Environment (OE) 2030 and beyond.
- CO4: Inform Future Force Structure.
- CO5: Future Force Informed Assignments.

Rich, Gregg, and I were impressed with the <u>focused effort and</u> <u>tactical to strategic perspective</u> that the consultants brought to the discussions. We have no doubt the final product produced by Team 20 and approved by the Chief will, indeed, modernize the Corps for 2030 and beyond. But, for now, we wait while the team considers the input received during the consultants meeting and develops recommendations for General Talley to consider, tweak, and approve.

A role for the SCA:

Team 20 presented a number of objectives to the conference. One was to "<u>develop programs and more opportunities for</u> <u>mentorship, include retirees</u>." This presents an opportunity and a responsibility for SCA membership, though we are not a retiree organization.

SCA members who are retirees, and who have the time and interest to do so, should reach out to the senior MSC on a nearby post and offer to participate in mentoring and professional development opportunities. To find the senior MSC Soldier start with the senior MSC at your local medical treatment facility and work your way up.

SCA members who are still wearing our Nation's uniform should reach out to MSC retirees and invite them into such opportunities. To find retirees, go to our SCA LinkedIn page and post a note there (and to two other sites).
